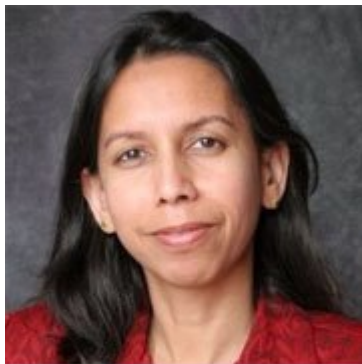

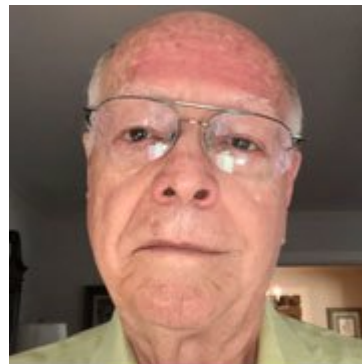

Presentation helps define options



The spouses and family members who accompany international students, postdocs and visiting scholars to Stanford have often paused their busy lives and professional careers in order to join their partner here. Time looms large as they seek to make a new beginning. The Spouse Education Fund Committee wanted to make new spouses aware of a broad range of options for making good use of their time here.

On October 11, the Spouse Education Fund Committee joined with Bechtel Spouse & Family Programs to offer a presentation, "Enhance Your Time Here: Opportunities for Online Learning". Colleen Silva-Hayden, who has broad experience developing online courses for both universities (Harvard) and online companies (Coursera), was the perfect speaker to introduce the wide spectrum of courses available online, and the differing characteristics of each. The conference room was filled as she presented an inspiring overview of how "Learning for a Vibrant Life" can contribute to their personal and professional growth.

This information will be especially helpful for those who apply for a grant from the CCIS Spouse Education Fund in November. Applicants are required to identify a course that relates to their personal or professional goals, and grantees will be selected through interviews.
